I. The Basis of Fellowship is Salvation

1 Corinthians 12:12-13 (NIV)

[12] The body is a unit, though it is made up of many parts; and though all its parts are many, they form one body. So it is with Christ.

[13] For we were all baptized by one Spirit into one body--whether Jews or Greeks, slave or free--and we were all given the one Spirit to drink.

Acts 2:42-47 (NIV)

[42] They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.

[43] Everyone was filled with awe, and many wonders and miraculous signs were done by the apostles.

[44] All the believers were together and had everything in common.

[45] Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need.

[46] Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts...

[47] ...praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

Galatians 5:13 (NIV)

[13] You, my brothers, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature; rather, serve one another in love.

1 Corinthians 10:16-17 (NIV) (communion)

[16] Is not the cup of thanksgiving for which we give thanks a <u>participation</u> in the blood of Christ? And is not the bread that we break a <u>participation</u> in the body of Christ?

[17] Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf.
