**Colossians 1:15-20 (NIV)**

<sup>[15]</sup> He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation.

<sup>[16]</sup> For by him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things were created by him and for him.

<sup>[17]</sup> He is before all things, and in him all things hold together.

<sup>[18]</sup> And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy.

<sup>[19]</sup> For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him,

<sup>[20]</sup> and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.

**John 1:1-3 (NIV)**

<sup>[1]</sup> In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

<sup>[2]</sup> He was with God in the beginning.

<sup>[3]</sup> Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made.

**Isaiah 43:10-11 (NIV)**

<sup>[10]</sup> "You are my witnesses," declares the LORD, "and my servant whom I have chosen, so that you may know and believe me and understand that I am he. Before me no god was formed, nor will there be one after me.

<sup>[11]</sup> I, even I, am the LORD, and apart from me there is no savior. "

2. **Healing the Nobleman's son** (4:26-54)

3. **Healing the Paralytic** (5:1-16)
4. **Feeding the Multitude** (6:1-13)
5. **Walking on Water** (6:16-21)
6. **Sight to the man born blind** (9:1-7)
7. **Raising of Lazarus** (11:1-44)

## **The Man Born Blind:**

### **John 9:1-7 (NIV)**

<sup>[1]</sup> As he went along, he saw a man blind from birth.

<sup>[2]</sup> His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?"

<sup>[3]</sup> "Neither this man nor his parents sinned," said Jesus, "but this happened so that the work of God might be displayed in his life.

<sup>[4]</sup> As long as it is day, we must do the work of him who sent me. Night is coming, when no one can work.

<sup>[5]</sup> While I am in the world, I am the light of the world."

<sup>[6]</sup> Having said this, he spit on the ground, made some mud with the saliva, and put it on the man's eyes.

<sup>[7]</sup> "Go," he told him, "wash in the Pool of Siloam" (this word means Sent). So the man went and washed, and came home seeing.

### **John 20:30-31 (NIV)**

<sup>[30]</sup> Jesus did many other miraculous signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book.

<sup>[31]</sup> But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.
